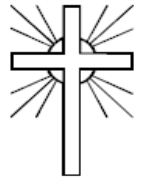

## **PAX CHRISTI**

The work of **Pax Christi – the Peace of Christ** – is based on the gospel and inspired by faith. Our vision is of a world where people can live in peace, without fear of violence in any form.

Pax Christi is rooted in Catholic Christianity but is open to all who share its values and work.

### **Pax Christi works for**

- **Peace** – based on justice. A world where human rights are respected, basic needs are met and people feel safe and valued in their communities.
- **Reconciliation** – a process which begins when people try to mend relationships – between individuals or whole countries after times of violence or dispute.
- **Nonviolence** – a way of living and making choices that respects others, challenges what is not fair or just, and offers alternatives to violence and war.

This Sunday, 23<sup>rd</sup> June, there is a service at 3pm at the Ukrainian Church, Bury Old Road, M7 4PX, to pray for peace in the Ukraine, the service will be in several languages and supported by the Bishop of Salford. Please feel welcome to attend.

## **Thoughts from today's Gospel Reading, Lk 9:11-17**

There are six Gospel accounts of the feeding of a crowd with loaves and fishes, and we wonder that it is Luke's account that is chosen for today's feast.

The event takes place near Bethsaida (a name which means "House of the Fishermen"), the place from where Simon Peter, Andrew and Philip came.

Before the feeding, Jesus preaches and heals during the heat of the day, and then the apostles suggest that Jesus send the people to buy their own provisions and to find lodgings.

Jesus' reply is strange and so is theirs - which makes the miracle-story even more dramatic. Except for "Raising his eyes to heaven (neither Mark nor Matthew say this)" Jesus does what he does in Luke's account of the Last Supper.

The feeding of the crowd thus becomes an image of the Last Supper and the celebration of the Eucharist.

### **Reflection:**

Jesus worked many miracles! But we must not forget that the greatest miracle is the resurrection of Jesus. Through their faith in Jesus, people begin to live in a new way, sharing bread with the brothers and sisters who have nothing and are hungry: "None of their members was ever in want, as all those who owned land or houses would sell them, and bring the money from them to present it to the apostles" (Acts 4:34-35). When a miracle is described in the bible, the greater attention is drawn not towards the miraculous aspect, but towards the meaning the miracle has for life and for the faith of the community of those who believe in Jesus, the revelation of the Father. In the "first world" of the "Christian" countries, animals have more to eat than human beings of the "third world". Many people are hungry! This means that the Eucharist has not taken deep root yet, nor does it reach out as it could and should.
