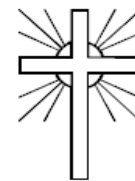

Thoughts from today's Gospel Reading: Luke 20:27-38

Chapter 20 is one of challenges. It opens with the chief priests and scribes asking proof of Jesus' authority; then the Lord tells the parable of the wicked tenants who came to hate their landlord and killed his son; and he outwits his opponents on the question of paying tribute to Caesar.

Now, in today's reading, the Sadducees challenge Jesus on belief in the resurrection. Their question is laughable: seven brothers die one after the other, the woman marries each one so that the law of Moses might be fulfilled, and then she dies.

But there is no laughter. This is ridicule, not humour. The Sadducees scorned belief in life after death.

Jesus' answer is perfect.

Eternal life is knowing God, not carnal knowledge.

There is no marriage in Heaven because the purpose of married love has been fulfilled on earth - the giving of life to the following generation. Moses himself, says Jesus, expresses belief in the resurrection by calling the Lord "the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob", implying they are still alive because God is God of the living.

See how the same story is told in Mark (12:18-27), Matthew (22:22-33), and then read St. Paul (1 Corinthians 15:35-57) for an even fuller answer.
