



Fr Martin writes.

Our Muslim friends and neighbours have now begun to mark the season of Ramadan, and perhaps especially this year, when we who could not attend church in Holy Week have an idea what it must be like for Muslims to be unable to attend mosque in Ramadan, we might want to reach out to our Muslim friends, family, neighbours, and workmates.

A simple greeting, by phone or social media, emailed, or posted on a card is enough. The traditional greeting is 'Ramadan Mubarak', which translates as 'Blessed Ramadan'. 'Happy Ramadan' is also perfectly acceptable - it is a joyous occasion for Muslims.

An understanding that Ramadan is a joyful time, with an increased focus on almsgiving, prayer, and studying the Qur'an, will be appreciated.

As Ramadan is a time of increased prayer, it is an ideal time to ask for prayers, and promise ours in return. We might also want to include good wishes to the whole family, as the meals in the evening (called 'iftars') tend to be social occasions, and make Ramadan a time for gathering friends and family together; this year those gatherings must be limited to people who already live in the same house.

A simple gesture expressing good wishes on our part could have a profound effect.

O Great Love, thank you for living and loving in us and through us. May all that we do flow from our deep connection with you and all beings.

Help us become a community that vulnerably shares each other's burdens and the weight of glory. Listen to our hearts' longings for the healing of our world. Knowing you are hearing us better than we are speaking, we offer these prayers in all the holy names of God, Amen.
