



At Team SPH, we spent last week's Mental Health Awareness Week building 'Five Ways to Wellbeing' which consisted of a number of activities that took place daily to support our Students' well-being.

Some of the activities were led by external guest speakers from 'Kooth' (an organisation which specialises in supporting positive mental health for young people) and a mindfulness coach which prompted Students to be mindful of their own well-being and of others.

Leading up to the Ascension, Students at SPH also celebrated this important Feast Day by attending Year group Assemblies on the theme of 'Witness' and what it means to bear witness to God.

Students were prompted to think about how they could be a positive witness and how they could follow in the footsteps of Jesus and his example. This was then discussed further in our SPH Weekly Reflection where the whole school engaged in our online collective worship about this theme.

This week, the theme of our reflection is 'Example', developing the idea of how our Students can set a good example or be positive role models within the community.

We look forward to sharing upcoming community events we will be leading/taking part in in the near future and inviting parishioners to join in too.

At the end of the half-term, we will also be working with The Nottingham Diocese Catholic Youth Service team who will be leading a whole school Liturgy for the Feast of St Peter and Paul.

This Sunday's Mass Readings are: Acts 2: 1-11; Psalm 103: 1, 24, 29-31, 34; 1 Cor 12: 3-7, 12-13; John 20: 19-23 Thoughts from today's Gospel Reading John 20 : 19-23 The season of Easter concludes with today's celebration, the feast of Pentecost. On Pentecost we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem; this event marks the beginning of the Church. The story of Pentecost is found in the Acts of the Apostles, today's first reading. The account in today's Gospel, John 20:19-23, also recounts how Jesus gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. Yet the event in John's Gospel takes place on Easter Sunday. There is no need to try to reconcile these two accounts. It is to we know that after his death, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send to his disciples a helper, an Advocate, who would enable them to be his witnesses throughout the world. In the context of the feast of Pentecost, John 20:19-23 reminds us about the integral connection between the gifts of peace and forgiveness and the action of the Holy Spirit. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." He breathes the Holy Spirit upon the disciples and sends them to continue his work of reconciliation through the forgiveness of sins. Jesus' act of breathing the Holy Spirit upon the apostles mirrors God's act of breathing life into Adam. In fact, both the Greek and Hebrew words for "spirit" can also be translated as "breath." This Gospel reminds us that the Church is called to be a reconciling presence in the world. The reconciling presence of Christ is celebrated in the Church's sacramental life. In the Sacrament of Baptism, we are cleansed of sin and become a new creation in Christ. In the Sacrament of Penance, the Church celebrates the mercy of God through the forgiveness of sins. This reconciling presence is also to be a way of life for Christians. In situations of conflict, we are to be agents of peace and harmony among people. © Loyola Press Litter pick update.
