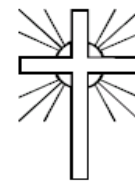

Mondays & Wednesdays:

Tuesdays are set aside for Holy Mass in schools and other institutions.

Thursdays & Fridays:

10.00am Holy Mass at St Mary Crowned Church.

Confession times: 10.00am -10.30am at St Mary Crowned, and 12.00 noon -12.30pm at All Saints.

Sunday Mass (including the Vigil) remains at the times in use before the pandemic:

(**Saturday**, 6.00pm All Saints; **Sunday**, 9.15am at St Mary Crowned, and 11.15am at All Saints).

Thoughts from today's Gospel Reading: Mk 8:27-35

Today's reading is the turning point in Mark's Gospel. In the presentation of the life and ministry of Jesus found in this Gospel, the deeds of Jesus have shown Jesus to be the Son of God. Yet many, including Jesus' disciples, have not yet realized his identity.

Today, Jesus asks the disciples what others say about him. He then turns the question directly to the disciples and asks what they believe. Peter speaks for all of them when he announces that they believe Jesus to be the Christ.

The word *Christ* is the Greek translation of the Hebrew word for Messiah, which means "the anointed one." At the time of Jesus, the image of the Messiah was laden with popular expectations, most of which looked for a political leader who would free the Jewish people from Roman occupation. Jesus does not appear to have used this term for himself. As we see today, Jesus refers to himself instead as the Son of Man, a term derived from the Jewish Scriptures, found in the Book of Daniel and in other apocryphal writings.

Many scholars suggest that the phrase Son of Man is best understood to mean "human being." Now that the disciples have acknowledged Jesus as the Christ, Jesus confides in them the outcome of his ministry: he will be rejected, must suffer and die, and will rise after three days. Peter rejects this prediction, and Jesus rebukes him severely. The image of Christ that Jesus is giving is not the image of the Messiah that Peter was expecting. Jesus then teaches the crowd and the disciples about the path of discipleship: To be Christ's disciple is to follow in the way of the cross.

The path that Jesus was inviting his disciples to share meant tremendous suffering and death. This is the kind of radical commitment and sacrifice that Jesus calls us to adopt for the sake of the Gospel. © Loyola Press

Parish Safeguarding Procedures – DBS Forms

As we open to more activities within our church communities, it is essential to ensure that all volunteers have an up-to-date DBS certificate.

Volunteer roles include: Catechists, Children's liturgy helpers, Extraordinary ministers, Visitors, Drivers and General helpers, anyone who comes into contact with children and vulnerable adults.

Volunteer duties must be covered by a diocesan DBS certificate even if the volunteer has a certificate from another role such as their employment.
