

### **A Reflection on today's Readings:**

The readings this week speak of restoration and healing. God has a plan for our future that will result in lasting peace and harmony between individuals, families, communities and nations. This will pave the way for reconciliation between the kingdom of God and humankind.

God knows us only too well. He acknowledges our need of a saviour, someone who will show us 'God's way' towards a better, more sustainable future, for us, and the planet we call home.

*'He was in the world that had its being through him, and the world did not know him. He came to his own domain and his own people did not accept him.'* (John 1 vs 10,11).

The gospel writer, John, was writing with the benefit of hindsight and guided in his writing by the Holy Spirit. John was setting out the enormity of our (humankind's) mistake, of not recognising Jesus for who he really was.

In the original context, John was referring to the people of Israel, the Jews, God's chosen people, those who should have recognised their long expected Messiah. But the lack of recognition is still evident today. So it remains 'our' mistake, 'our' failure to respond to God's love.

*'But to all who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to all who believe in the name of him who was born not out of human stock or urge of the flesh or will of man but of God himself'* (John 1 vs 12,13).

For John and us, any claim to be the children of God is entirely down to the action of God. As believers, we have been adopted into God's family on the basis of our faith in Christ.

The writer of 'Ephesians' says *'Blessed be God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with all the spiritual blessings of heaven in Christ. Before the world was made he chose us, chose us in Christ, to be holy and spotless, and to live through love in his presence.'* (Ephesians 1 vs 3-5).

As Christians, we acknowledge that *'the Earth is the Lord's'* (Psalm 24 vs 1). We are all inhabitants of a world that God has made for us.

It is right that we should *'Praise the Lord our God. God is Love: let heaven adore him; God is Love: let earth rejoice; let creation sing before him, and exalt him with one voice.'*
