May is the month of Mary! As I mentioned in last week's sermon. St Bernadette witnessed to flowers being at the feet of "the beautiful lady" when she appeared to her by the river, in a cave in Lourdes in 1858. This led to flowers being laid at Marian shrines all over Europe. We need to reclaim the Marian Shrine particularly at St Mary Crowned Church, which has become a hangout place for the young lads of the neighbourhood.

In Thanksgiving to Mary for prayers answered, place flowers at our shrines in both Churches. I invite parishioners to come together 30 minutes before the weekday Masses in the great prayer of the Rosary, that most stable of Catholic devotions. Also to pray the Hail Holy Queen (page 344 – parish mass books) at the conclusion of prayers of the faithful/Bidding Prayers. (FG)

<u>Continuing our Marian theme</u>. On Saturday it is the 100th anniversary of the Fatima apparitions. The **Three Secrets of Fátima** consist of a series of <u>apocalyptic visions</u> and <u>prophecies</u> which were given to three young Portuguese <u>shepherds</u>, <u>Lúcia Santos</u> and her cousins <u>Jacinta and Francisco Marto</u>, by a <u>Marian apparition</u>, starting on May 13, 1917. The three children were visited by the Virgin Mary six times between May and October 1917. The apparition is now popularly known as <u>Our Lady of Fátima</u>.(FG)
