

Thoughts from today's Readings:

First Reading Deuteronomy 8: 2-3, 14-16

Moses is soon to die. He has gathered the people around him to remind them (Deuteronomy means "a second telling") of how God has blessed and guided them, testing them in the wilderness to see if they deserved to be the Chosen people. During that hard time of probation God gave them bread (manna) and water, the essentials for desert life, but wanted them to learn that bread alone was not sufficient: it was the Word of God by which they were to spiritually live.

Feast of Corpus Christi - we celebrate the Word of God become the Bread of Life.

Gospel Reading John 6: 51-58

John's Gospel has no account of the Eucharist at the Last Supper - but in today's reading we hear Jesus explain to the crowd the full meaning of his feeding them with loaves and fishes at the opening of chapter 6.

Jesus' talking to them has brought memories of Moses and the liberation from Egypt and of the food and drink that God provided in the wandering through the desert: now Jesus has fed them in a similar miraculous way.

Their murmurings (vv.41-43,52) draw from Jesus a fuller explanation of this gift for Eternal Life. Manna had been an image of Jesus: the God-given bread an image of the Word and Bread of Life.
