<u>Bishop Patrick</u> has written to us this week concerning the ongoing campaign against slavery.

It is hoped that the praying of the prayer will be a good way of keeping the issue of human trafficking and modern slavery alive within the congregations of the Diocese. Wednesday is a day of focus for this issue.

For the victims of human trafficking

We pray for the victims of human trafficking and all those in any kind of slavery

We pray for those rescued from slavery, that they may heal from years of abuse

We pray for retail managers, that they may rid their supply chain of enforced labour

We pray for the men and women who care for those who have been rescued from slavery

We pray that the Church will rise up and lead the fight against modern slavery

We pray that we may understand our complicity, in buying the goods produced by this evil trade We pray that together we can bring an end to

modern slavery

Our Lady, Mother of Mercy, pray for us

Know the signs of potential modern slavery/human trafficking: Does someone living on your street or serving you in their job:

show signs of physical or psychological abuse?

look malnourished or unkempt?

often wear the same clothes?

appear withdrawn or frightened?

appear under control or influence?

have little opportunity to move freely?

appear totally unfamiliar with the neighbourhood?

seem to be living and working at the same address?

live with a large number of seemingly

unrelated people?

get picked up daily and dropped off again

very early/late?

<u>Last week I gave notice of 'Adoremus'</u> the name given to next year's Eucharistic Congress. This event in Liverpool is over 3 days 7th – 9th September. I believe that **the Friday is a day for Catechists and Eucharistic Ministers** and I would encourage and support any catechist/Eucharistic Minister who is willing to attend to let me know asap as names have to be submitted.

The Saturday is the main day and is scheduled to happen in The Echo Arena in Liverpool - which can accommodate 10,000 pilgrims - will be the home to a six-hour stage programme, which will include a Congress Mass, keynote speakers including Bishop Robert Barron, an excellent speaker, and a drama highlighting the beauty of reverence and devotion.

The day will conclude with Adoration. I have to submit names for this event so please register your interest asap.

On the final day (Sunday 9th September) there will be a Procession through the city, remembering that this was an illegal activity when there was a last Eucharistic congress in England in 1908. If you are interested in going, please tell me and I am thinking that if there are enough people we could get a coach and travel together to Liverpool. <u>Holydays of Obligation</u>: with effect from 1st Sunday of Advent 2017: two holy days of obligation are being reinstated. This decision was made by the Bishops of England and Wales, and has been confirmed by the Holy See. The days are: **The Epiphany of the Lord** – 6th January (transferred to the adjacent Sunday when it falls on a Saturday or a Sunday. **The Ascension of the Lord** – Thursday after the 6th Sunday of Easter.
