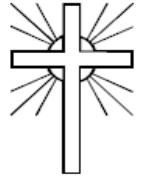

Thoughts from today's Readings:

Gospel Reading: Mark 1 : 14-20

Today's reading is a powerful dramatisation of the truth that four fishermen were Jesus' first disciples - but it is not how it really happened. John and Luke tell very different stories of how the first four apostles were called - John of how he and Andrew were disciples of John the Baptist before becoming followers of Jesus, and Luke's speaking of a miraculous catch of fish being an overwhelming sign for Peter. Today's story from Mark (very similar in Matthew) is the simple truth that four fishermen gave up their full-time work to follow Jesus.

They knew him well: James and John were his first cousins, their mother Salome being the sister of Mary, and Peter and Andrew were friends and work colleagues of theirs.
