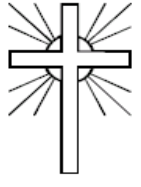

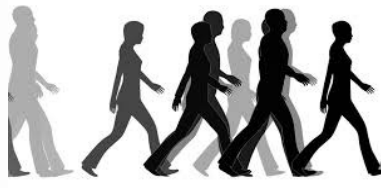


TENTH SUNDAY OF 2018

REFUGEE WEEK –
A CAFOD CAMPAIGN to SHARE THE JOURNEY

The Church has been at the forefront of reaching out to refugees and migrants. But so far world leaders are not meeting the challenge. Alongside Catholics around the world, we must call on them to step up.

Pope Francis launched 'Share the Journey', in November last year, and urges us to reach out to our brothers and sisters who are forced to flee their homes, and stand up for the rights of refugees and migrants.

You can Share the Journey by joining us on a walk. Schools, parishes, and local communities across England and Wales, including our own, will be walking to show solidarity with people on the move. Together, as CAFOD supporters, we are aiming for 24,900 miles – the distance around the whole world.

CAFOD will use this shared journey to deliver a powerful message to world leaders, who meet in September and December 2018 to agree two global agreements on refugees and migration. These agreements must ensure refugees and migrants can live with dignity.

Thoughts from today's Gospel reading: Mark 3: 20-35

In the section of the Gospel just before these verses, Jesus calls his Twelve Apostles. Now he performs his first exorcism. It is told within the context of conflict with his family.

A crowd so large has gathered that Jesus and his disciples are not even able to eat their bread. His family comes to take him away because they think he is beside himself. And the scribes think he is possessed by the devil.

Jesus points out to them the absurdity of their thinking that he uses the devil to cast out demons. In fact, it is Jesus who ties up the strong man, Beelzebub, and overcomes him.

He concludes with a brief saying about the forgiveness of sins. All sin can be forgiven except for blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. It's not known exactly what he means by this.

It could be that the only sin that can't be forgiven is the one that cuts you off from the source of forgiveness, the Holy Spirit.

Mark then brings Jesus' family back into the picture. They are not presented in a critical light but are just trying to see him. This gives Jesus the opportunity to point out that family for him is not based on blood.
