

REFUGEES AND MIGRANTS


Thank you to our parishioners and friends who joined in the Walks of Solidarity in July.

Thoughts from today's Gospel Reading: Mark 6: 30-34

The apostles return from the mission on which Jesus had sent them (last week's Gospel reading).

They had gone in pairs - but where?

Was there an agreed day for their return? They tell what they had done and taught.

Were they prepared with a set programme or were they free to reflect the teachings of Jesus as they thought best?

The questions are of value because they are about the Church's teaching: how should the Church reflect what Jesus said and did?

When new questions arise, that Jesus would not have discussed with his apostles, the Church believes in the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Did Jesus promise his Spirit would be with the apostles on this, their first solo missionary journey?

With gentle concern Jesus welcomes them back, wants them to rest and to eat, and then takes over as the crowds gather.

He, alone, takes on the teaching role as the apostles rest and listen.

It is a beautiful pastoral scene.

In Jesus, everything is revelation which fascinates or captivates him from within!

He himself is the proof, the living witness of the *Kingdom*.

In him appears that which happens when a person allows God to **reign**, allows God to guide or direct his or her life.

In his way of living and acting together with the others, Jesus transformed the nostalgia into hope!

All of a sudden people understood: "This was what God wanted for his people!"

And this was the beginning of the announcement of the Good News of the Kingdom which was rapidly diffused in the villages of Galilee.

In a small way, like a seed, which then grows until it becomes a big tree, under which people could rest (Mk 4, 31-32).

And people took care to diffuse the News.
