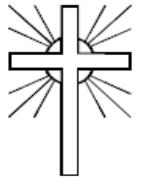

## **Thoughts from today's Second Reading: Eph 4: 1-6**

The plea of today's reading echoes last week's prayer for unity in God's love. Paul, with the Church, is concerned with the breaking apart of Christian community. The two elements of Jew and Gentile have been brought together in Christ, but the danger of separation and division is always present.

Chapter four opens with the practical call of fulfilling that prayer: they must be tolerant, gentle and patient, aware of sharing a common baptism, but also of the individual grace given to each member. They must rejoice in a common call and individual blessings.

#### **People of God**

*What a varied collection of saints the Church remembers . . . .*

**St. Peter Chrysologus** (30<sup>th</sup> July) lived in the 5<sup>th</sup> century - first as a monk and then as a bishop. He is famous for his short, pithy sermons which earned him the name "Chrysologus" (golden speech).

**St. Ignatius Loyola** (31<sup>st</sup> July) served as a soldier but his life was changed when he was recovering from being injured in battle. In his long convalescence he began to read spiritually and a longing to serve Christ grew within him. He gathered disciples around him and they formed the Society of Jesus - which has been the most active and the most numerically strong congregation in the Church's history - The Jesuits.

**St. Alphonsus Liguori** (1<sup>st</sup> August). A gentle humble man who was a successful lawyer before becoming a priest. He loved the poor, and to serve them founded the congregation of the most Holy Redeemer - the Redemptorists.
