Thoughts from Today's Gospel Reading: Mark 13:24-32

Chapter 13 is Jesus' longest speech in Mark's Gospel. He tells of the destruction of the Temple (end of the age) and of the coming of the Kingdom of God. Mark tells us that Jesus spoke these prophecies only to Peter, James, John and Andrew (in that order), but Matthew and Luke suggest that it was to all the disciples.

Jesus speaks of signs; first, of the afflictions the disciples will have to face; then, of the destruction of the Temple; and in today's reading of the coming of the Son of Man, the completion of the Kingdom.

The angels of the four winds that will destroy the world (an image carried on in the Book of Revelation) will gather God's elect to the wonder of eternity.

A simple parable ends the reading.

We know the seasons and the land - so learn to read the signs of the times. We smile. The signs are always being repeated!

Yes, for everyone and for every age the passing and changing nature of the universe can be seen by the human race and by every individual person.
