Thoughts from Today's Second Reading: 1 Cor 12

Paul is disturbed at disunity in the Corinthian community. People are jealous of each other's gifts and he wants them to see that God gifts everyone differently - but always for the blessing of the whole community, the body spiritual.

In verses 22-27 Paul seems to suggest that the weakest and least in the community are the ones to be most honoured - the sick, the elderly, the mentally infirm.

God has created the body and we must learn to see it as God does, and a sign of this common understanding is that when one part of the body is in pain the whole person suffers.

We must look after one another. Compare the list of spiritual gifts in verses 27-30 to the one Paul gives in verses 8-10.

You will be interested in the contrast, but notice that the gift of tongues comes last in each list: the gift most likely to be commented on, even to be most proud of because it is so unusual, is the least important of the aifts.

Spiritual pride, boasting and showing off, have no place in Paul's way of thinking.
