

# **Q&A: Fr Martin writes:**

Here's those questions that people submitted with their completed questionnaires during our consultation on the times of Sunday Mass. <u>**Q.**</u> Why can't you have 9.00 St Mary's and 11.00am at All Saints?

**Q.** What about 9.30am at St Mary's and 11.15am at All Saints?

<u>A.</u> The pastoral council and I chose the 9.15am and 11.15am suggestion as one of the two options for the questionnaire because it means only a quarter of an hour's change for each parish, and each parish changes a little, instead of one changing and one staying unchanged.

That latter solution, expecting one parish to bear the disruption of a changed time for Sunday Mass while the other one keeps what they're used to, doesn't seem to fit well with our Catholic ethos of bearing one another's burdens (Luke 3:11, 2 Corinthians 1:5, 1 Timothy 6:18, Galatians 6:2, etc.).

Some people have indicated that even 9.15am will be an effort for them, so 9am would have been even more difficult.

You may remember that one of the recommendations that arose from the 'You Are Living Stones' consultation run by Bishop Malcolm was that, to lessen the anxiety of priests and preserve their reverence, the start times of two Masses celebrated by the same priest should not be closer than two hours: the 9.15am and 11.15am solution meets that standard.

**Q.** What is this third parish you refer to? **A.** As priests die; or retire, sometimes at the standard age of 75 or, increasingly, earlier because of ill health; or are moved, as I just was, leaving no resident priest in the town they used to serve, it's usually a neighbouring priest who is asked to take on the parish made vacant. Not always -- I once was tasked with caring for a parish the other side of one of the neighbouring parishes to the one I then served, but that was only a temporary arrangement. So my best guess is that the third parish, when the time comes, sooner or later, will be Hadfield, Gamesley, Charlesworth, Marple Bridge, New Mills, or Chapel en le Frith. **Q.** There are a large number of children preparing for their communion. Surely part of communion could be reading the prayers?

<u>A.</u> Not all children of first communion age would be able to, or would be happy to, read the bidding prayers. If it became an expectation that part of the preparation for first holy communion is taking a turn in leading the bidding prayers at Sunday Mass, then I'd be worried that for some children this would be an ordeal. I invite the first communion catechists to let me know what they think about this question.

# Father Martin's Induction Mass on Tuesday.

Canon Don Bowdren, our Dean, is expected to preside at the induction Mass at St Mary Crowned on Shrove Tuesday, 5<sup>th</sup> March. Holy Mass begins at 7pm, God willing, and is followed by a shared table supper in St Mary's Hall.
