

Thoughts from today's Gospel Reading, Lk 10:1-20

Only Luke tells of this mission. Manuscripts of his Gospel vary the number of disciples, 70 or 72, and the number symbolises the nations of the world (Jews thought in terms of 70/72 nations) besides recalling Moses' choice of 70 elders (Exodus) when God's Spirit also fell on Medad and Eldad who were back in the camp.

The details of ministry are strangely emphasised - "Salute no one on the road" - and seem very local to the Holy Land whilst giving a good picture of Jesus' strategy in his developed ministry.

The blend of loving care and severe condemnation also provide an insight into the Aramaic mindset (loving God and hating father and mother simply means to put them in second place). The mission is not attractively presented.

The omitted verses, 13-16, are even more condemning and we wonder how much is cultural, how much is Gospel. The severity of condemnation for not listening to Jesus' disciples is only for not listening to them, nothing to do with living evil lives.

Would faithful Jews, not wanting to become followers of Christ, be so condemned?
