Thoughts from today's Gospel Reading:Luke 18:9-14

Here is a parable in which each of us can star. We take the place of the humble tax collector, whilst others might give us the place of the proud Pharisee! "Church is full of hypocrites" sneers the man: "Come and join us, there's room for one more" comes the reply.

We call each other Pharisees and sinners - but are they also you and me?

The parable is confrontational and unpleasant. We wonder why Jesus is so antagonistic and bold towards the Pharisees. Why does he seek enmity with them when some (Joseph of Arimathaea and Nicodemus) were his friends?

The meaning of the parable is clear.

Observing religious duties strictly, and even generously, is of little value if done with pride; whilst humbly acknowledging our sinfulness opens us to the mercy and forgiveness of God.

Note the final sentence, summing up the lesson, and see where else Jesus teaches the same truth - Luke 14:11, Matthew 18:4, 20:26, 23:12.
