Our Parish Prayer Group

The prayer group meets up weekly, on Friday evenings. In the winter, we meet at All Saints church, in the summer months, at St Mary's church. We start at 7.45pm and generally finish around 9.15pm.

There is no formal structure, but this is an example of how the meetings go. We begin with a prayer of thanks, followed by a short period of silence. We generally use the Magnificat publication to look at the readings for the following Sunday, with the Prego Plus resources to develop our understanding of the scriptures. We share any meditations or reflections which have been helpful to us in the preceding week. We ask for God's help for people we know who are struggling with difficulties.

We occasionally visit places as a group such as talks, retreats and special days.

We have been given some copies of St Matthew's gospel and if you decide to join us, you will receive a free copy.

Thoughts from today's Gospel Reading: Mt 2: 1 - 12

The visit of the Magi occurs directly before the story of the Holy Family's flight into Egypt.

Matthew's Gospel tells a version of Jesus' birth that is different than the one in Luke. Of the actual birth of Jesus, Matthew tells us little more than, "When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod . . ." The story of the census is found only in Luke's Gospel, but we hear about the visit of the Magi only in Matthew's Gospel.

We know little about the Magi.

They come from the East, journey to Bethlehem following an astrological sign, so we believe them to be astrologers. We assume that there were three Magi based upon the naming of their three gifts. The Gospel doesn't say how many Magi paid homage to Jesus.

In Matthew's Gospel, they represent the Gentiles' search for a saviour. Because the Magi represent the entire world, they also represent our search for Jesus.

We have come to see the gifts they bring as a foreshadowing of Jesus' role in salvation:

Gold as representing Jesus' kingship,

Frankincense a symbol of divinity because priests burned it in the Temple,

Myrrh, used to prepare the dead for burial, is offered in anticipation of Jesus' death.

The word Epiphany means "manifestation" or "showing forth." Historically several moments in Christ's early life and ministry have been celebrated as "epiphanies," including his birth in Bethlehem, the visit of the Magi, his baptism by John, and his first miracle at Cana.

The story is full of symbolism. The star is guidance for those seeking to find God - the "light" of today's first reading.
