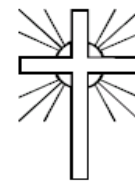

Fr Martin writes:

This Sunday, 24th May, our Muslim friends and neighbours celebrate the feast of Eid, the joyful end of Ramadan. This year in particular, when we who could not attend church on Easter Sunday have an idea what it must be like for Muslims to be unable to attend their mosque, we might want to convey friendly greetings to our Muslim friends, family, neighbours, and workmates.

A simple greeting, by phone or social media, emailed, or posted on a card is enough. The traditional greeting is 'Eid Mubarak', which translates as 'Blessed Eid'. 'Happy Eid' is also perfectly acceptable.

A simple gesture expressing good wishes on our part may go some small way (or even a long way, for someone) in building the peace that should exist among those who, though differing in creed, still believe alike in one God who is compassionate and merciful. Pentecost Sunday - May 31st -

National Rosary Rally 9am to 9pm

Pope Francis is encouraging Catholics to pray the Rosary in their family homes during the month of May, especially when the Pandemic is making us aware of the value of our families and making it possible for us to pray together in lockdown at home. He encourages simple Rosaries and joining online Rosary initiatives to pray to Our Lady for deliverance from Covid-19 and he has composed two prayers for this intention. I invite you to join in an initiative that follows on the Pope's request, the **Pentecost Sunday National Rosary Rally**, from 9am to 9pm across Scotland England and Wales.

Our Diocese has been asked to pray a Rosary Hour at 10 am and I warmly invite you to take part.

This is in the form of a [Rosary relay Rally](#) where the Dioceses designated in their **Rosary Hour** encourage the peoples across their Diocese to pray the Rosary either, individually, in families, as online prayer groups, parish groups, and where possible led online by their parish priests and Bishop. It does not matter what time during the specified hour that the Rosary is prayed. *Cont..*

Then on the hour the next Dioceses take up the Rosary relay Rally and so on until 9pm, when the Rosary Rally will end with a Rosary led by Bishop John Keenan from St. Mirin's Cathedral in Paisley.

Thoughts from this week's Gospel Reading, Jn 17:1-11:

The Gospel takes us back to a special place, the room where the Last Supper took place. Here Jesus prays, making known to his disciples – and to us – the name and teachings of the Father. Eternal life is to know the Father and Christ and their intimate relationship together.

Reflection:

I prepare for my prayer time slowly, becoming aware of my body, mind, heart; bringing whatever arises to the Lord. I ask the Holy Spirit to help me pray with a listening, humble heart.

When ready, I savour and linger over these profound words of Jesus, relishing their divine wisdom, letting them resonate within my being.

I may not want to read the whole passage at once; I can return to it later.

Perhaps I find myself conversing with God; being drawn into a deeper relationship with the Father and the Son as revealed to me through Scripture.

Perhaps I become aware that God desires to share his life and the wonder of his glory with me now, especially in these difficult days.

Once again, I speak with the Lord, either in words from my heart, or silently, allowing spontaneous feelings to arise from within.

When I am ready, I mark the end of my time with the Lord with a gesture (such as the sign of the cross) or my own prayer. Maybe I note what has been significant during this time, and can later share this with a friend.
