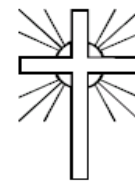

## **News from St Mary's School:**

It gives me great pleasure to share a number of key events and highlights that have been taking place at St Mary's during the Pentecost term. It has been another jam packed few weeks which has kept us all busy with some fantastic learning and experiences taking place.

**Stronger together:** Year 6 have been enjoying taking part in some drama workshops since we returned from the half term break. As a school we have been assigned a practitioner in drama who has been responsible for working with the children to create a performance piece with the view to come together as a whole Trust at Derby Theatre at the beginning of July where their talents will be showcased. This is sure to be a memorable experience.

**Road safety:** This week, all children across school took part in a virtual Road safety workshop, led by the Derbyshire Road Safety team. During the workshops, the children were reminded of road safety messages, the importance of staying safe when walking on and crossing roads. Neve in Year 2 said that she learnt to 'Stop, look and listen when crossing the road'. Alfie remembered that 'it is important to hold an adult's hand' and Matilda said, 'When the lights are red stop, and when they turn green, you can cross'. The children thoroughly enjoyed the workshops and learnt a lot of important messages!

**Staff Retreat day:** On the INSET day last week, Mary Farmer came into school to lead a retreat, in which all the staff took part. The retreat was focused upon the theme 'Called'. Throughout the morning, the staff had the opportunity to explore scripture, reflect upon their 'calling' and they were provided with the resources, and guidance to pray in different ways. Staff commented on the day saying - "A lovely morning which allowed us time to reflect & engage in much needed relaxation. The activities were perfect for staff to consider all we are grateful for and all that we would still like to achieve. A morning for me." Another commented - "A great time to reflect on our busy lives. Great activities to enjoy."

## **Fratelli Tutti National Assembly:**

Through the assembly, the children were given the opportunity to explore the letter that Pope Francis has written for the world. In this letter, Pope Francis is asking us to reach out to our sisters and brothers in need, whoever they are, wherever they may come from. Pope Francis also challenges us to turn outwards and think of ourselves as one global family,

The children watched an animation on the encyclical, a film about CAFOD's work in Venezuela and Peru, clips from children in schools living out the gospel and exploration of how they can all put *Fratelli Tutti* into action. After the assembly, the children made pledges as to how they can listen, be kind and be a good global neighbour. Lots of children in Year 3 pledged to recycle more and Flynn said, 'I will continue to help people ride their bikes', whilst Evie said, 'I promise to save water and care for pets'. We are looking forward to seeing our pupils strive to become good global neighbours!

**School visits:** It has been great to get back up and running with class visits. Following strict Co-vid19 protocols we have been able facilitate children enriching their learning experiences off site which has helped them to develop key knowledge and skills. Year 3 and 4 had a wonderful educational time at 'The Tropical Butterfly House' in Sheffield and I know that pupils in Year 1 and 2 are really excited to visit 'The Yorkshire Wildlife Park' next week.

**Pupil Parliament:** Congratulations to Heidi and Oscar our two Pupil Parliament representatives. They have already met with colleagues across the Trust and the St Ralph Sherwin CEO, Sean McClafferty. They equipped themselves really well and are looking forward to sharing their ideas and the latest developments with us all.

**Year 6 Bucket List:** Year 6 have been busy working through their 'Bucket Lists'. We wanted the children to leave St Mary's with some really special memories and in partnership with their ideas, staff also chipped in to create a bespoke passport. As well as being academic, the activities chosen are fun and designed to support the development of the whole child. <b>This Sunday's Mass Readings:</b> Wisdom 1: 13-15, 2: 23-24; Psalm 30: 4, 5-6, 11, 12, 13; 2 Cor 8: 7, 9, 13-15; Mk 5: 21-43 <b>Thoughts from today's Gospel Reading Mark 5 : 21-43</b> Jesus has been in the Decapolis region, an area of ten Gentile cities on the far side of the River Jordan. Now, today, he crosses to the Galilee side of the lake and two healing miracles take place. Do make time to see how Matthew (chapter 9:1-26) and Luke (chapter 8:40-56) tell of the same cures. Mark's is the best telling and again we wonder if his was the original version which the other two have adapted? But why alter what is so good? Mark and Luke speak of Jairus's daughter being gravely ill, whilst Matthew says she is already dead - but the point is that Jesus has power over life and death. Verses 39-42 are precious with detail of Jesus' Aramaic tongue ("Talitha, cum"), the age of little girl, Jesus' question and the crowd's response. The healing of the woman is strangely included within the two parts of the story of Jairus's daughter. Again Mark's account is best detailed. The woman has been failed by doctors (v.26), her cure and reaction are detailed (v.29-30), Jesus' reaction to her touch is more vivid. Two beautiful healing stories blend: the faith of Jairus and of a woman are blessed. Note that Jesus is aware that power is taken from him - even when he is unaware of the request. © Watermead Apostolate
