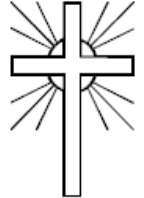
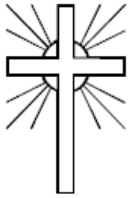

# TWENTY NINTH SUNDAY OF 2023 – 22<sup>nd</sup> OCTOBER

### **Fr Martin writes,**

It's approaching that time of year when we remember with special devotion those of our loved ones who have died.

*May they all rest in peace.*

If I want my mum and dad, may they rest in peace, to have a share in every Holy Souls Mass offered in the year ahead, I put a note with their names, along with my offering, in one of the "Month of the Holy Souls November Dead List" envelopes. Then, every single time I see that Holy Mass is offered for the Holy Souls, I know they have a share in that Mass.

If I want them to have one Holy Mass offered for the repose of their souls, then I use the ordinary Mass Offering envelope, the type that is printed with a space for names to be written on the outside of the envelope. I will then see in the newsletter "Arthur and Tessa Sylvester RIP" listed as a Mass intention.

It is perfectly fine to use an ordinary envelope, giving clear instructions, for example, "My offering for Holy Souls Masses. Please include [names] RIP in all the Holy Souls Masses" or "My offering for Holy Mass to be offered for the repose of the soul of [name] RIP."

Envelopes should be returned to Royle House, Church Street, Glossop SK13 7RJ or put in the weekly collection.

People can also go online to arrange Mass offerings or add names to the Holy Souls list. Please visit [paypal.me/fathermartin](https://paypal.me/fathermartin) and use the form of words that is recommended above when using an ordinary envelope. When you work your way through the simple steps to submit your offering, do not tick "paying for goods or a service" -- we never pay for Holy Mass! The price of every Mass ever to be celebrated was paid by Jesus Christ with his Precious Blood on Calvary. Our offering for a Mass is a gift to cover, or at least contribute to, the priest's living expenses for the day he offers Holy Mass for our requested intention.

### **Receiving Holy Communion from the Chalice:**

We have been able to receive Holy Communion under both kinds again since Easter. However, please consider carefully before receiving Holy Communion from the chalice if you are feeling unwell or have recently developed a cough.

While the Church teaches that Holy Communion 'has a fuller sign when it takes place under both kinds', it also teaches that the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ is present in both the Sacred Host and Precious Blood, and so there is no obligation to receive Holy Communion from the Chalice.
