St Mary Crowned Development News

Fr Martin writes, "I know many, like me, were delighted with the repairs to St Mary Crowned, and are looking forward eagerly to the second phase of our plans to make the church more fit for a parish that is aspiring to be more outward-looking and missionary.

"We are planning to build two lavatories (one of them accessible to people with disabilities) near the font end of the church, and a self-contained area that will have facilities for refreshments and meetings.

"Sadly the 'faculty' that was issued when we first submitted our plans has expired, because of the delays caused by the pandemic, and we have to go through the process again. Three different diocesan committees have to express their opinion and until all of them agree to grant approval, we can't begin work. "It's not uncommon for one or more of these committees to seek changes or demand further information, and since each of them meets only a few times a year, delays soon build up. "Our joint parish maintenance committee is persevering patiently in navigating through this frustrating process, and I remain confident that, God willing, sooner or later everything will line up and work may begin.

"I am profoundly grateful to the members of our joint parish maintenance committee for their generous and skilled guidance. Please pray for them -- and for the diocesan committees whose consent we must obtain to carry on this work."

Today we celebrate the fourth Sunday of Lent. This Sunday is known as Laetare Sunday.

The first word of the Entrance Antiphon is Laetare, the Latin word for rejoice, for this is a Sunday of joy, when we look forward to celebrating the resurrection of Jesus at Easter and the salvation this offers to us.
