When you can no longer get to church

Father Martin writes, one of the joys of our celebrations of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi last week was the annual renewal of the commission of our extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. We are truly blessed to have so many dedicated extraordinary ministers, not only to serve at Holy Mass, but also to ensure that a practicing Catholic who because of illness, disability, injury or frailty becomes unable to leave their home is nonetheless able to receive the Blessed Sacrament regularly.

If a housebound, practicing Catholic from another parish moves into a nursing home in one of the Glossop parishes, their own parish priest will normally let Fr Martin know so they may continue to receive Holy Communion, but sadly this is not always a foolproof procedure, as sometimes a person's family doesn't tell the priest about the move and he is unable to discover the person's new location. Thankfully in many nursing homes, but not all, staff who are alert to their residents' spiritual needs will ask if their new resident used to receive Holy Communion at home.

If you are a practicing Catholic in a Glossop parish, and you become housebound and so cannot continue to attend Holy Mass, please don't hesitate to get in touch.

The best way to let us know is by sending an email to homecommunions@glossopcatholics.org.uk - this will go to the extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion who have generously volunteered to act as contacts for this purpose. If you become aware of someone else in the same situation, or who has moved into a Glossop parish after receiving Holy Communion at home in another one, then please ask their permission (or their carer's permission if appropriate) and let us know.
