The Anniversary of the Dedication of All Saints Church

Father Kevin Athaide, Diocesan Archivist, shares, the Howards, dukes of Glossop, took up the town in 1606, and built Glossop Hall in 1729. The Hall was run by agents of the family from 1737, and among these were the Catholic Eyre family, who brought priests up.

Among those priests was the French émigré Father Joseph Barbe, who escaped the new terror in his native land and arrived in Glossop in 1803.

The first small chapel appeared near the hall in 1810, during Father Barbe's time in Glossop.

Father Barbe was followed by Father Theodore Fauvel, another French priest, in 1831, when Royle House was built. He also was chaplain to Glossop Hall, a dedicated man who did all his work on foot and was well known to people who used the roads. In his time came the new church (1836). He also witnessed the establishment of a new parish in the town, although the new church there would be built when his successor Father Tasker was at All Saints.

The involvement of the Howards in the running of the parish ended with the death of Francis Howard (1924), when the property was made over to the Diocese. The present church was founded (1835) and opened on the 19th of July, 1837. The architect was M. E. Hadfield, a local of the town and nephew of Mr. Matthew Ellison, agent for the Howards, who financed the building.

The church was consecrated in 1936, the 150th anniversary of its completion celebrated in 1986 over several days.

Padley Pilgrimage

The Diocese writes, in 1588, two Catholic priests were arrested at Padley Hall in Derbyshire — Nicholas Garlick (born in Dinting, Glossop) and Robert Ludlam — and executed in Derby for their faith. They were beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1987. The pilgrimage to Padley Chapel each July honours their witness. The small chapel that survives on that site has drawn pilgrims ever since. Every summer, Catholics from across the dioceses of Nottingham and Hallam walk to it together. The pilgrimage has a long tradition of welcoming people of all ages.

The Annual Padley Pilgrimage takes place on Sunday 12 July 2026. Pilgrims gather at Grindleford train station at 3pm for the Rosary procession to Padley Chapel, where Mass begins at 3:30pm. The walk from Grindleford Station to Padley Chapel is short and suitable for families with children. Bishop Patrick McKinney will be the main celebrant. The preacher is Monsignor John Armitage, Master of the Guild of Our Lady of Ransom.
