Rest in Peace

Safe Place Scheme

Derbyshire County Council writes, have you heard about our keep safe cards? You can use them to get help at one of our Safe Places. A Safe Place is somewhere you can go if you need help, are lost or feel scared when out and about. They include libraries, shops, restaurants, pharmacies, visitor attractions, GP surgeries and more. They have stickers in their windows so you can see that they are part of the scheme and know you can go in and ask for help if you need to. You can also download the Safe Places app to your smartphone, free to download from the App Store or Google Play. This can direct you to your nearest open Safe Place and can work by voice activation.



'Keep Safe Cards' are available to all adults who live in Derbyshire. Vulnerable young people aged eleven to eighteen can also apply for a 'Keep Safe Card'. The card has space for you to write your name, the name and phone number of a

family member or carer and anything else a person might need to know about you.

If you're out and about and you need help, you can take the card to a Safe Place to ask for help. The Safe Place Scheme is supported by Derbyshire Police, Trading Standards and the Derbyshire Learning Disability Partnership Board.
